Savanna Maue: NOTO Arts District plans arts and antiques festival at Great Overland Station

This week I wanted to bring attention to an event that combines two of my great loves: art and antiques.

While it's still a few weeks away, on March 15 and 16 the NOTO Arts and Entertainment District is hosting a two-day event featuring art, eclectic antiques, and specialized industrial and vintage wares.

Admission to the festival will be part of the Great Overland Station's regular rates: \$2 for children ages 2 through 12, \$5 for seniors and \$6 for adults. This price will also allow admission to the museum and its various features.

In addition to the vendors, NOTO has asked some of its longtime artists and friends of the arts to offer workshops throughout the weekend at their shops in NOTO. So far, the festival has an art demonstration scheduled at 39 West Gallery, Shelly Bedsaul will give acrylic folk art and block printing demonstrations, Barbara Waterman-Peters will discuss portrait painting, Scott Weird will demonstrate making a cigar box (with one box to be raffled off that day) and many others soon to be announced.

A VIP session will be offered to Friends of NOTO, (a membership to support the arts), with early admission on Friday. The general public may attend the VIP session, but at a higher entrance fee. During this time the Best of Show awards will also be announced.
